

## Pro Elite Sire Incentive Guidelines

### NFR P.E.S.I. Bonus...

A \$15,000 P.E.S.I. Bonus will be available annually at the NFR. Bonus money will be paid accordingly: \$1,000 to the high placing enrolled horse in each perf. And, there is \$5,000 to the enrolled horse whose performance leads to the rider claiming the NFR World Championship and Average. If the World Championship is won by a rider on one enrolled horse and the Average is won by a different rider on a different enrolled horse (as happened in 2009), the \$5,000 will be split equally, thereby each horse would be awarded \$2,500. WC and AVG bonus money would only be awarded if the rider competes on the enrolled horse in a minimum of 5 rounds.

### Circuit Finals P.E.S.I. Bonus...

\$500 Circuit Finals Bonus will be available at each Circuit Finals. Bonus will be awarded to the top placing P.E.S.I. enrolled horse competing.

### Stallion Enrollment...

Stallion enrollment is annual. The fee is \$1,000 per year for the first three consecutive years. Once a stallion has maintained a paid enrollment for three consecutive years his annual enrollment fee will be reduced to \$750 per year. Should a stallion enroll then drop out or lapse on enrollment for a period of more than 2 months, the annual enrollment fee will remain at \$1,000 and the discount will be waived with no consideration given for the number of years of consecutive participation, in addition, grandfathering of progeny will be discontinued until such time as the stallion is once again a paid in full participant. Stallions will only be eligible for stallion awards on offspring which were enrolled, or which is the result of matings that occurred, during a season when the stallion was an active P.E.S.I. participant.

### Progeny Enrollment...

Progeny of all ages shall be accepted under the grandfathering clause for \$150 per horse, for as long as the sire maintains consecutive enrollment. Horses who have not yet reached performance age (three year olds & under) may opt to pay in using the following payment system:

1 <sup>st</sup> payment due on or before Dec. 31 of the weanling year	\$50
2 <sup>nd</sup> payment due on or before Dec. 31 of the yearling year	\$50
3 <sup>rd</sup> payment due on or before Dec. 31 of the two year old year	\$50
4 <sup>th</sup> payment due on or before Dec. 31 of the three year old year	\$50

Progeny of stallions who have dropped out the P.E.S.I. program, but who are the resulting offspring from a season during which a stallion was enrolled will be accepted as follows: weanlings to three years old, either thru the above payment schedule or for a one time fee of \$200; horses four to six years old for a fee of \$400; horses six years old and older will be accepted for a fee of \$500.

### Money Distribution...

Beginning January 1, 2010, all advertised P.E.S.I. Bonuses shall be split 60% to the Owner, 10% to the Breeder and 30% to the Stallion Owner. 80% of all monies received from stallion and progeny enrollments will be put into a secure account to be distributed as bonus money. Office charge of 20% from all fees paid per horse will be deducted in the year of the payment for promotion and administration of the P.E.S.I. program. The bonus money portion of nomination/enrollment fees from horse not yet of competition age will be held for payout until a futurity horse's four-year-old year unless P.E.S.I. is notified in writing that the horse will not be competing until it turns five years old. The bonus money portion of the enrollment fees for horses five years old and older will be added to the total purse the next competition year after payment. Bonus monies will be paid on at selected sanctioned events over the course of the season and distributed directly from the W.P.R.A. Office.

### General Rules...

- 1) P.E.S.I. reserves the right to refuse any nomination.

- 2) All disputes arising out of the application or interpretation of any rules or conditions of the P.E.S.I. shall be decided by P.E.S.I.
- 3) P.E.S.I. reserves the right to alter the conditions of all or part of the program as it, in its sole discretion, deems advisable. P.E.S.I. may cancel the program at any time and refund money, excluding interest, if it deems the participation is insufficient to justify the program.
- 4) All money will be handled by the WPRA's staff accountant and maintained in a separate P.E.S.I. account.
- 5) A current listing of nominated sires & progeny that are named & paid in full will be on the WPRA's web site: [www.wpra.com](http://www.wpra.com) and in Women's Pro Rodeo News or the official publication.
- 6) To be eligible for bonus money, a horse's owner/agent is responsible for designating on entry forms that the horse is enrolled in P.E.S.I.
  
- 7) P.E.S.I. Futurity Bonus
  - Futurity must be WPRA co-approved
  - Riders must identify themselves as WPRA members by providing their WPRA #
  - Horse must be paid in full enrolled in PESI and ridden by a WPRA member
  - Horse should be identified to producer by registered name prior to running as PESI Bonus eligible
  - If P.E.S.I. Bonus Money is offered in a WPRA Sidepot, contestants must enter the Sidepot
  - P.E.S.I. Bonus Money will be paid on the Average
  - Number of places paid will be determined by the total PESI Bonus offered
  
- 8) P.E.S.I. 4D Bonus
  - 4D must be WPRA co-approved
  - Riders must identify themselves as WPRA members by providing their WPRA #
  - Horse must be paid in full enrolled in P.E.S.I. and ridden by a WPRA member
  - Horse should be identified to producer by registered name prior to running as P.E.S.I. Bonus eligible
  - If P.E.S.I. Bonus Money is offered in a WPRA Sidepot, contestants must enter the Sidepot
  - P.E.S.I. Bonus Money will be paid on a per round basis
  - Number of places paid will be determined by the total P.E.S.I. Bonus offered per round
