

# RULE PROPOSALS

**Proposed by Jewels DeNapoli** – pg. 18 - 3.3.3. Current Circuit Directors are to remain neutral during the election process for their replacement. They are not permitted to use WPRA resources such as member email lists, phone lists, online social networking pages/groups, online forums, WPRA and/or Circuit Websites to promote one candidate over another. Current Circuit Directors are also not permitted to distribute contact lists to others members for the use of promoting one candidate over another. Directors should distribute all election material/platforms at the same time and not show favoritism.  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Jerri Mann** – pg. 18 - 3.3.1 Permit holders are not to have a vote in the election.  
**MOTION PASSED/EFFECTS OTHER RULES**

**Proposed by Sammi Bessert** – pg. 19 - 3.4.1. The auditor shall open the ballots and certify the results to the WPRA Secretary on October 1 of each year. The Secretary shall promptly notify the candidates of the results.

**Note:** Change March 1st to October 1st. This will allow for the current competitors to make educated decisions on who they vote for at a time in the season where there isn't as much going on. Also, this would allow a transition period between outgoing and incoming officers to start fresh for the new year.  
**DEFERRED UNTIL OVERALL ELECTION DISCUSSION**

**Proposed by Jewels DeNapoli** – pg. 20 - 4.2.1. add- Directors must plan on attending a majority (more than half) of the total number of rodeos in their Circuit. Directors must conduct at least one member meeting a year to discuss members concerns, rule proposals, rule changes, ect. Directors are responsible for encouraging PRCA rodeos to approve and continue to approve the barrel racing.  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Jewels DeNapoli** – pg. 20 - 4.2.2.1 Spokeswomen will be active members that participate in or attend a majority of the rodeos in their State/area. Spokeswomen will be evenly distributed throughout the Circuit especially those larger Circuits with multiple States. They must also have a good understanding of the current rules.  
**REVIEW WITH LATER SUBMISSION FROM DONNA IRVIN**

**Proposed by Sammi Bessert** – pg. 31 - If a contestant declares a circuit outside of her principle place of residence for 5 consecutive years, she should be considered a resident and therefore will comply with rule 8.5.2.1 - 1.) pertaining to circuit residents.  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Stacie Coke** – pg. 59 - I would like to see the rule changed for buddying with a PRCA card holder. With the cost of fuel quickly rising, I believe you should reconsider the criteria. I am engaged and live at the same address as my fiancé and because we are not married, we can not buddy. Last year we had to go to rodeos separately several times which does not help the household budget and caused us to limit our rodeos.  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Tana Renick** – pg. 63 - I would like to propose that there be unlimited trades for 2011-2012. This creates a hardship on the members with as many rodeos as there are.

**Note:** If this could be presented at the next board meeting and go into effect for the remainder of this year and 2012, this would really benefit the members.  
**NO MOTION. RULE 10.6.1.5. CHANGING TO 4 (FOUR) FREE TRADES PER RODEO YEAR**

**Proposed by Jewels DeNapoli** – pg. 66 - 10.6.5.3. A Contestant CANNOT enter a rodeo with the intent to trade her position with a friend or family member and then release or turnout from rodeo. Example: Two contestants cannot enter a rodeo separately to better the odds for one contestant on getting into a performance or better position in a rodeo. The contestant that trades and then releases or turns out of the rodeo with be fined an additional \$250.  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Pat Spratt** – pg. 83 - I would like to delete the wording in rule 12.11 Barrel Pattern, 12.11.1, 12.11.2.4 and 12.11.2.5, where it says 45 feet, to change it to 60 feet at least, if arena allows more, make more, as some of the rodeos are

not using the entire arena and making short stopping room because it says they can.

**CLEAN UP BEING APPLIED TO ALL**

**Proposed by Lexie Gross** – pg. 86 - I was wondering if it were possible to make a rule notating when Hand-flags (hand timers) were used on the results sheets by the rodeo secretaries? We've been having problems in the northwest where many of the rodeos will be hand-flagged due to the timer not working, and the times will tend to be fairly off. Also is there a rule for using back-up electric timers? I think having a backup timer running and working at every rodeo would be a good idea! Being a professional association backup timers would enhance the idea of a professional sport, not an "open rodeo."  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Mary Burger** – pg. 86 - I would like to propose that it be added to Rule 13.1.1.1 that with any rodeo adding \$ 10,000 or more that there be two electric timers.

**As it reads now:** 13.1.1.1. Equipment necessary: complete electric eye timer plus one extra timing clock or two stopwatches to be operated manually.

**NO MOTION – REVIEWING IN LIGHT OF POSSIBLE NEW ELECTRIC EYE PROGRAM**

**Proposed by Lynn K. Brown** – pg. 97 - 20.1.1 In the event of a co-approval...All monies won in the 1D and 2D will count towards WPRA National and Circuit Standings. The breakdown to be as follows... 1-200 Entries only 1D earnings count 201-and above Entries 1D and 2D earnings count

**As it reads now:** 20.1.1 In the event of a co-approval, payoffs and rules of the primary association will be followed. All monies won in the 1D will count for national/circuit standings if applicable for both adult and/or junior divisions.

**Note:** Review the current year results and you will find many rodeos that placements are paid down to 2D times and you don't have to run against as many horses...Sonora CA, 2nd GO Guymon, Bakersfield CA, Riverdale CA, Logandale NV to name a few. If you run (as we do in Texas) against 600-900 horses over a weekend for one pot the 2D times should count. We are a barrel racing association that gleans much of our monies from members dues, fines, sanctioning and sponsors. Not everyone is running for the NFR, they don't have the horsepower, means, work schedule, sponsors or finances or just don't want to leave home...but they do want to run locally and would like to have a goal of making a finals or being qualified for some bigger event. Most in the organization are not only motivated by money but prizes and prestige of making it to a finals. Wasn't the finals last year a 2D format?  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Patti McCutchen** – pg. 147 - In rule 14.1.1 Event Champions will be determined by money won at WPRA approved add and co-approved events including the finals. Delete "as determined by the Board of Directors at its discretion."

**As it reads now:** 14.1.1. Event Champions will be determined by money won at WPRA approved events as determined by the Board of Directors at its discretion.

**Note:** If we are going to count co-approved events for standings, it should be listed in the rule book. This rule was illegally instated a year when the board weighted different jackpots and rodeos with triple, double and single points to inflate standings so it would "look better" and it was done mid-year. New members should be able to read our rule book and see how points will be tabulated when deciding to buy a card.  
**MOTION PASSED**

**Proposed by Patti McCutchen** – pg. 151 - Please number rules in Chapter 16 according to the numbering system used in the rest of the rule book.

**Note:** Also Please follow the protocol for changing rules. I notice the board has changed the bylaws to allow the board to basically do "whatever they want to whenever they want to" (Rule 4.1.2) but expect us to send in rule changes so they can be posted on the web site and in the magazine. Examples of rules that were changed last year are the deletion of Bull Riding and Bronc Riding and the cancellation of our magazine that almost happened. These were never listed as rule changes. Also the addition of committees that the board can just appoint. These extra committee members cost our association money. Please give us the courtesy of listing these changes with all the rule changes so we may contact our director with discussion

**MOTION PASSED – WE WILL LOOK INTO IT**

**Proposed by Patti McCutchen** – pg. 153 - In rule Chapter 16 Rule 2 Delete the portion that says For co-sanctioned team roping, only the two highest placings shall count toward a member's year end team roping points.

**As it reads now:** In order to qualify for the WPRA Team Roping Standings, the team must be a "female only" team. For co-sanctioned team roping, only the two highest placings shall count toward a member's year end team roping points. No mixed teams will be considered for approval If one partner of the team is not a WPRA member, but is also female, then the partner who is a WPRA member shall be eligible to count her half of the winnings toward WPRA Standings. A roper's winnings shall count toward "header" or "heeler" Standings, based upon the end which she initially entered on. Acceptable roping formats are: a) "All-girl" Numbered ropings, must demonstrate that the number system, in use, is based on the team roping industry standard, current USTRC Numbering System.

**Note:** If we allow events to be approved that you may enter more than once, all money won should count. This is very confusing and even though I have ask the board and office twice how we are to count it, nowhere is the criteria stated. As I wrote the previous board who approved this, the way this reads, someone who won a higher place in a go around than in the average, would have the smaller amount counted. Also, some members may head and heel in the same roping and this wasn't clarified. I understand why the rule was proposed with the old system of earning points, but with all the co-approvals now I feel this limit should be lifted. Plus, this is just one more confusing rule for our office to have to keep straight when standings are sent in.  
**MOTION PASSED**

**Proposed by Lynn K Brown** – pg. 43 & 78 - 9.2.9.3 and 12.3.9 What does 9.2.9.3 have to do with "working horses on "official" pattern?"

**Note:** Rule # 9.2.9.3 Member shall be allowed to set up her run as necessary, without circling. (if you circle there is a \$100 fine). A spin or pivot is acceptable. No intentional dismounting. If a member takes an excessive amount of time she may be fined \$100 at the judge's discretion. 12.3.9 then the same "verbage appears under "if a gate is centrally located.." now you are telling me I don't have to keep a forward motion I can "set up" my run even if it's a centrally located gate?  
**MOTION PASSES LANGUAGE TO BE CLEANED UP**

**Proposed by Lynn K. Brown** – New - Any WPRA junior card will be eligible to purchase a WPRA card upon turning 18. If she has won less than \$1000 upon turning 18, the monies won will carry forward to her permit.

**Note:** (Most junior members believe this is going to happen when they turn 18)  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Lynn K. Brown** – New - 12.11.1.1 (New) All barrel patterns must be squared. When a standard pattern is set a 300 foot tape will be used to square the eye making sure that the distance between the eye and 1st barrel and the eye and 2nd barrel are equidistant. (place example of how to square the eye in the rulebook with drawing)

**Note:** If a non standard pattern is set then the pythagorean theorem can be used ( $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$ ) the square root of  $c^2$  will then be determined to verify that the distance between the eye and 1st barrel and the eye and 2nd barrel are equidistant. Eyes will be set after measuring tapes are used to cross 1st barrel to second barrel eye marker, and a tape will be used to cross 2nd barrel to 1st eye marker. In a standard pattern without a 300 foot tape your "cross" measurement would be 108.1 feet. (Measuring from 1st barrel to the 2nd barrel eye marker should equal 108.1 feet and conversely from 2nd barrel to the 1st eye marker will be 108.1 feet) This additional rule ensures that right or left handed horses are not placed at a disadvantage because the eyes were measured off the fence or "straight" back from the barrels. Even though an arena looks perfectly square or rectangular that is not always the case. For each 1 foot is equal to one-tenth of a second. If a barrel marker is off 6 feet - then a contestant potentially can be 3/10ths-5/10ths off on time.  
**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Lynn K. Brown** – New - 12.9.8 (New) Ground conditions at WPRA approved events can only be fixed or changed with the consent of Director/Spokeswoman and

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I judge and/or the judges who are allowed to discuss the conditions and changes with a tractor driver. Any contestant discussing ground conditions, telling the tractor driver to dig deeper, water more or change the ground conditions before the first barrel racer competes or from a previous slack or performance will be subject to a major fine violation. Ground conditions are to be maintained as closely as possible from a previous slack or performance unless deemed unsafe then refer to rule 12.10

## REVISIT AT A LATER DATE

**Proposed by Linda Vick** – Policy - If a person is qualified for a limited rodeo in both years use their previous year qualification and drop down on the new year.

**NO MOTION – REVIEW WITH JIMMIE MUNROE - SEE POLICY SUBMISSION**

**Proposed by Tannis Kobold** – Policy - Re-design the circuit / monthly schedule tab on the website so you can weed out all of the co-sanctioned barrel races and roping's from the rodeo's. I would like to go straight to Rodeos or straight to Barrel Races. It is frustrating and takes forever when you are trying to make a plan of action on which rodeos you want to attend and you have to shift through all of the co-sanctioned events.

**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Tannis Kobold** – Policy - Provide the service and ability to pay rodeo fees and fines through the WPRa website, versus calling them in.

**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Sammi Bessert** – Policy - Aside from these rule proposals I have some concerns as to the Tour Finales. I understand there has been a lot of work with the Omaha committee to secure additional money for the Tour Finale. I think this is great and am very happy to see these steps being taken. As far as Puyallup, I think there needs to be some serious consideration as to the benefit of this rodeo to the WPRa and barrel racing as a sport. I am aware that the Puyallup committee has gone to great lengths to try to improve their ground conditions, but for whatever reason, horses are still falling down and risking injury. I had the opportunity to enter Puyallup last year and decided against it. Because of the lower amount of money added to the barrel race and the risk we are asking our members to take by going there, I wonder if eliminating that approval should be considered. Does Puyallup give the WPRa competitors an opportunity to showcase the best horses in the sport in an environment that allows them to earn significant money toward progressing to Omaha and the NFR? I believe last year 1 girl from the Friday set placed in 1 round and no one from the Friday set made the finals. After significant ground trouble on Friday, the Finals had to be stopped and run after the rodeo. Just a thought and something for you as a board to consider.

**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Maegan Reichert** – pg. 86 - Mandatory Rule: The electric Eyes should be checked and charged with a BACK UP timer at all rodeos. There should also be two stop watch times. I have been in Tour Rodeos with over \$10,000 added and received no time of either... It has cost me several times to name a few, Dodge City, Spanish Fork, and Henderson... of which timer dont work and secretary did not have a stop watch time... I know from my experience and it had to effect others too. Just good business to have back up timers and stop watch times on the books.

**NO MOTION – REVIEWING IN LIGHT OF POSSIBLE NEW ELECTRIC EYE PROGRAM**

**Proposed by Donna Irvin** – pg. 84 – 12.12 Marking Barrel Permanent marked patterns must be measured and a copy of the pattern must be posted as per rule 12.12.7.

Reasoning: with the crazy weather, etc. there was a circumstance last season when a stake was pulled on a "permanently staked pattern". There was not a posted copy of the pattern dimensions.

**MOTION PASSED**

**Proposed by Donna Irvin** – pg. 24 – 4.1.10 Delete National Finals Rodeo from the rule regarding "There will be an annual meeting of the WPRa Board of Directors.

**As it reads now:** 4.1.10. The regular annual meetings of the WPRa Board of Directors shall be held at the National Finals Rodeo. The Board, by rule, may provide for other regular meetings at stated times and places, of which no notice shall be required.

## MOTION PASSED

**Proposed by Donna Irvin** – pg. 81 - 12.9.1 Committee is required to have a tractor and the necessary equipment to prepare ground in the arena to be as safe, fair and consistent as possible throughout the event. For example, if slack is in the morning and the barrel race is first in slack, the ground should be watered and worked at least (2) hours prior to the start of slack

**As it reads now:** 12.9.1. Committee is required to prepare ground in the arena to be consistent throughout the event.

**Reason:** Reasoning: some committees think that a gator with a piece of fence is appropriate equipment to work the ground. Being more specific about equipment required and Moving the example (from 12.9.6 to 12.9.1) about watering and working the ground 2 hours prior should make this more clear.

**MOTION PASSED**

**Proposed by Donna Irvin** – pg. 25 - 4.2.2 WPRa Spokeswomen will be selected by each Circuit Director and approved by the Board of Directors. Spokeswomen must be current cardholders and maintain a working knowledge of the WPRa rulebook. Spokeswomen's duties are to assist and communicate with the Circuit Director regarding grounds and conditions at WPRa events; assist with membership drives; serve as mentors to new members; and work on awards, circuit events and public relations.

**MOTION FAILED**

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 66 - 10.6.5.3 To fill the performance at a one go-round rodeo that has slack after the performance, ProCom will print the slack list with priority codes and send to secretary. To fill the performance, girls may be pulled up from the slack (if it held immediately after the perf or next morning) in the order of the priority list drawn for that rodeo. Those being pulled from slack would run at last in the perf. (which keeps the priority list in order). To be eligible for the pull, contestant must request (in person) the pull at least 2 hours before the rodeo with the secretary. At that time, the secretary will determine the contestant(s) with the highest priority requesting the pull and post the new running order. Turnouts/releases will be deleted, remaining contestants moved up and the contestants pulled from slack will be added at the end. Any pulls will NOT change the position of the drags in slack. If contestant does not request in person the pull she is not eligible and will be disqualified from rodeo, but is responsible for any applicable fines and entry fees. A second rule infraction for not following the ?pull? rules will result in a \$500 fine.

**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 59 - 10. 4.2.4. At priority preference rodeos that are back to back, there is no trading among contestants. Both gos must be traded as one. If you trade your first go, you must also trade your second go to the same contestant.

**As it reads now:** 10. 4.2.4. At priority preference rodeos that are back to back, there is no trading among contestants. Both gos must be traded as one. If you trade your first go, you must also trade your second go to the same contestant.

**MOTION PASSED**

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 63 - 10.6.1 ? Revisit trade/conflict rules - uniform to PRCA

**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 66 - 10. 6.5.2. Contestant cannot trade up within her performance, or section of slack, to better her position. Contestant will run where drawn.

**As it reads now:** 10.6.5.2. Contestant cannot trade up within her performance, or section of slack, to better her position.

**MOTION PASSED TO CLEAN UP CURRENT LANGUAGE**

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 67 - 10.7.1.5.1 A member becomes immediately ineligible when she uses a third release, and remains ineligible until fines are paid. The first misuse of releases is a minor rule violation and carries a \$250 fine plus the amount of entry fees at all effected rodeos. A second misuse of release becomes a major violation and carries a \$1000 fine and a 3-month period of ineligibility.

**Note:** After spending another night discussing releases, to save us time in the future I am proposing the following rule.

If we change it to a minor, we don't have to bring it before the board and they all get handled consistently, plus we can talk about the fines so maybe the word will spread and if we put some teeth into it maybe we will have less abuse. (the entry fees will go into the association, not be distributed, although I wish we could, we do not have the manpower.)

**NO MOTION**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** - Junior Section- Add All WPRa Junior members can compete in the WPRa Futurity and Derby events, provided that they abide by all rules as stated under the guidelines of the WPRa Futurity and Derby Program.

**MOTION PASSES**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 100 - 1.1.1 Strike "NO membership (card, permit or otherwise) will be issued to anyone under the age of eighteen (18), unless the age in of the majority in the state which the applicant is a citizen is greater than eighteen (18), in which case the membership will not be issues until the applicant reaches the age of majority in that state.

**As it reads now:** 1.1.1. Membership is limited to women, as demonstrated by a copy of a birth certificate. No membership (card, permit or otherwise) will be issued to anyone under the age of eighteen (18), unless the age of the majority in the state which the applicant is a citizen is greater than eighteen (18), in which case the membership will not be issued until the applicant reaches the age of majority in that state.

**MOTION PASSES**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 100 - Rule 1.1.2 Delete and add-All Futurity and Derby competitors must have either a WPRa card, permit or WPRa Junior card.

**As it reads now:** 1.1.2. Non-rodeo, Futurity and Derby membership only \$175.00 includes a subscription to the official publication of the WPRa, and the WPRa's insurance.

**Note:** if these are approved there will be some rule cleanup that will need to be done

**MOTION PASSES**

**Proposed by Jimmie Munroe** – Policy - Qualification for limited entry rodeos during the early part of the rodeo season will be as follows:

- 1) Rodeos that have entries closing on or before January 31st of the current rodeo year would be 90% from the prior year's standings and 10% from the current standings, at the rodeo's entry closing date.
- 2) Rodeos that close between February 1st and the last day of February would be 80% from the prior year's standings and 20% from the current year standings, at the rodeo's closing date.
- 3) Rodeos that close March 1st through March 15th would be 50% from the prior year's standings and 50% from the current year standings, at the rodeo's closing date.
- 4) Rodeos that close after March 15th would be only current year's standings.

**MOTION PASSES TO CREATE A NEW POLICY AND SUGGEST USE WITH COMMITTEES**

**Proposed by Brenda Mays** – Policy - 1. At rodeos that guarantee "no conflict" it has to be driveable or it will be considered a conflict. Girls are getting up at rodeos that run slack after and up in slack the next am, as an example, 12-24 hrs away and are being told it's not a conflict because it's not the same day. Those are impossible to drive. Then getting charged with a non-conflicted trade if they do get traded.

2. Don't charge girls a non-conflicted trade that don't initiate the trade. Girls won't trade because of this using up their non-conflicted trades.

3. All short go's should be random draw. You're punishing the girls for doing good by going slowest to fastest and the fastest girls getting bottom of the ground.

4. Girls should be able to make exhibition runs at rodeos, as long as it isn't on the horse they will compete on, unless they have already competed on that horse. Girls are getting fined for taking exhibition runs to help fill performances that have lots of turn outs in them. If they do exhibition their competition horse, before they make their run on said horse, make it a major fine.

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 59 - 10.4.2.4 At priority preference rodeos that are back to back, both goes must be traded as one. If you trade the first go, you must also trade your second go to the same contestant.

**As it reads now:** At priority preference rodeos that re back to back, there is no trading amongst contestants.  
**Motion passes to clean up current language**

**Proposed by Tana Poppino** – pg. 66 - Contestants cannot trade within her performance, or section of slack. Contestant will be drawn out.

**As it reads now:** Contestant cannot trade within her performance, or section of slack, to better her position.  
**Motion passes to clean up current language**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 101 - 1.2.1 All lead sanction futurities must have a minimum of \$1,000.00 added  
**As it reads now:** 1.2.1. All futurities must have at least \$1000.00 added.

**Entire Futurity/Derby section being rewritten**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 101 - 1.2.3 All lead sanction derbies must have a minimum of \$500.00 added  
**As it reads now:** 1.2.3. All derbies may have at least \$500.00 added.

**Entire Futurity/Derby section being rewritten**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 101 - 1.2.7 is a repeat delete”all entries must be a WPRa member in good standing and have their horse nominated to the futurity/derby program.” This is listed twice in the same paragraph.

**As it reads now:** 1.2.7. All entries must be WPRa members in good standing and have their horses nominated to the Futurity/Derby Program. All entries must be WPRa members in good standing and have their horses nominated

to the Futurity/ Derby Program. Upon purchase of a Futurity Card membership, Permit membership or WPRa card membership, said member has until January 1 to nominate up to three horses for free into the Futurity and Derby Program. This is only valid at the time of purchase or renewal of said membership. All horses nominated after renewal or purchase of membership will be charged \$25.00 per horse. All horses must be nominated each year, not just for sidepots. This includes a signed nomination form, which can be found on the WPRa website, along with a copy of the horse’s registration papers.

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 102 - 1.3 need to add lead sanction Futurity and Derby events, for this section

**As it reads now:** 1.3. Entry Fee Scale  
**Entire Futurity/Derby section being rewritten**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 102 - 1.3.6 committees may hold 25% of entry fees out with 5% going to the WPRa lead sanction events. The 5% does not apply to WPRa futurity and derby side-pots or co-approved events.

**As it reads now:** 1.3.6. Committees may hold 25% of entry fees out with 5% going to the WPRa.  
**Entire Futurity/Derby section being rewritten**

**Proposed by Susie McConaghie** – pg. 104 - 1.4.9 co-approved events shall be paid off according to the lead sanctioning event producer

**As it reads now:** 1.4.9. Side pots will pay one place for every four (4) entries in the 1D, and one place for every six (6) entries in the 2D. Example: 5 entries = 1 money in 1D 12 entries = 2 monies in 1D and 2 monies in 2D.
