

Pendleton Breakaway Roping Ground Rules

Qualifications

- Contestant must enter the Horse Heaven Round-Up, Kennewick, WA.
- Contestant **must** also enter the Pendleton Round-Up Sidepot (\$75) at the Horse Heaven Round-Up.
 - The side pot monies will be jackpotted back at 95%, (5% WPRA) paid out per the WPRA rule book.
 - The side pot monies will count toward 2019 Columbia River and Wilderness Circuit and World Standings.
- The top 24 contestants in the Pendleton Round-Up side pot will advance on to the Pendleton Round-Up.
- In the case that it does not fill with the top 24 from the Pendleton Round Up Sidepot, it will fill from the 2019 WPRA World standings per entry closing date for Kennewick, in order, of those that have entered the Pendleton Sidepot at the Horse Heaven Round-Up. If fewer than 24 enter the sidepot and Pendleton Roundup, only that number will be taken.

Ground Rules

- Entry Dates will be set by WPRA and will be through the NexGen Rodeo App
- Entries for the Pendleton qualifier will be with Kennewick entries, qualifiers for Pendleton must enter through Next Gen specifically for Pendleton
- 8 Ropers will rope Wednesday, September 11th after the tie-down roping during the 1:30 Performance of the PRU
- 8 Ropers will rope Thursday, September 12th, after the tie-down roping during the 1:30 Performance of the PRU
- 8 Ropers will rope Friday, September 13th, after the tie-down roping during the 1:30 Performance of the PRU
- Score will be the same as the PRCA TD roping 12'
- Electric eye barrier will be used in all timed events. If electric eye fails, the hand pulled barrier will be used and all times will count as recorded.
- Calves will be chute run (not drawn)
- Each Roper will get a first breakaway run on their calf
- Only one loop will be used
- There will be a 30 second time limit
- Will use the same liners as the PRCA TD roping event
- Ropes are tied to the saddle horn with heavy duty nylon string
- Calf's head must pass through loop or contestant will be disqualified
- Loop may draw up on any part of the body after head passes through the loop
- Field judge will flag contestants when rope breaks away from horn
- Contestant receives no time should she break rope from saddle horn by hand or by touching rope or string after catch is complete
- Trades will be allowed
- Ropers will compete in the following order/days, based on the Pendleton Qualifier criteria.
 - Wednesday, 9-11
 - 24-17
 - Thursday, 9-12
 - 16-9
 - Friday, 9-13
 - 8-1
- One Go-Around
- Entry Fee and payout will be determined per WPRA rulebook
- Added Money will be \$1000
- Standings will count for Columbia River and Wilderness Circuit Standings and World Standings per Roping Cut off date.
